- 2. Fire Department Update** - Over the course of this past weekend, the fire department responded to over 151 calls for service to include; several structure fires, wildland fires (both City and BUFSA), and motor vehicle crashes to include significant crashes involving extrications, river rescue, EMS calls, utility calls, etc.

There was a period of time on Sunday that every piece of fire department emergency apparatus was deployed and unavailable for additional responses. This included 4 brush trucks and 1 water tender that DNRC was providing staffing for. The fire department had overlapping structure fires, wildland fires, motor vehicle crashes and EMS calls. This was significant as we called in the standby crew as well as two ALL-CALL requests for additional personnel w. These crews assisted in not only our wildland fires, but also structure fires and motor vehicle crashes as well.

The fire department's call volume continues to increase with more calls coming in simultaneously and/or overlapping; this certainly continues to challenge the department's response capability. (see enclosed photos)

3. **Lillis Park Pickle Ball Courts Ribbon Cutting** – The Billings Park and Recreation Department would like to invite you to the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at Lillis Park on Tuesday, September 15th at 12:00 pm to celebrate Billings' first dedicated pickle ball courts. The Parks and Recreation Department repurposed tennis courts that were in serious disrepair and had been closed due to safety issues. Using PD1 funds the department was able to repair and resurface the tennis courts into six (6) dedicated pickle ball courts to meet the needs of the growing number of pickle ball players in our community.
4. **Coronavirus Survey** – The City of Billings will receive Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding to support individuals and families in Billings. Activities must exclusively support coronavirus and other infectious disease response, primarily benefit low-income individuals and families and not duplicate local, state or federal service or support. The **Coronavirus Survey** was designed to gather data to help determine priorities before allocating funding for a coordinated coronavirus response within the Billings community.

The **Coronavirus Survey** will be mailed with a full 4-week cycle of utility/water bills that started on Friday, September 4th. Survey responses are requested by September 30, 2020. Billings residents will have an opportunity to complete the paper survey mailed to them or they may complete the online survey, which is available at:
