

# Billings City Administrator Weekly Report

December 22, 2021

- 1. Outdoor Ice Rink** - The Parks Division has begun construction of the ice rink at Veterans Park. The ice rink is a very popular program when the weather allows for a rink. The process is very slow at the start as water can only be added in small amounts until a two-inch layer has been created. This requires multiple small applications per day. Once a thick base has been achieved water can be added at a faster rate to increase the ice thickness and smooth out the surface. The weather can be a considerable issue also, a 20-degree day with the sun doesn't freeze the water fast enough and causes the process to backup. The weather after Christmas looks very promising and should allow the rink to be completed and ready for use by January 7th.
- 2. New Playground Equipment Coming to Terry Park** - The Parks Division began the removal of the old playground equipment at Terry Park. Staff also is preparing the location for the install of new equipment in early 2022. The old equipment and concrete supports were dug out and disposed of. The existing fall protection must be removed, and the site must be excavated to 15 inches. This ensures that once the new equipment is installed there is enough depth so that the correct amount of fall protection can be added to meet all safety standards. A large Green Ash tree was also removed to make more space for play equipment and improve safety.



- 3. Road Condition Information** - The City has installed road condition cameras in a couple of areas along Shiloh Road. The cameras also measure precipitation, wind speed, air and road temperature and many other parameters. The parameters are not shown on the website yet but are being added. The intent of the cameras is to help Public Works be more efficient and effective during storm events. As people are aware, we may see an inch or two of snow in one part of town and three or four in another area. By looking at the camera, the staff will be able to decide when and how much equipment to deploy to certain areas of the city. Also, the products that we use have differing effectiveness in various situations and the data that we collect will ensure we use the correct product for the conditions. We have two cameras installed along Shiloh road now but will be adding more. The next location is Zimmerman Road north of Rimrock Road. Many commuters want to know the condition of Zimmerman before they leave their home or office, and these

cameras will allow them to look and decide the best route for their commute. The Public Works Department repairs and maintains over 500 miles City owned transportation surfaces including streets, alleys, sidewalks and multi-use trails. The Department also manages over 4,000 street lights, and over 30,000 traffic signs. There are 113 signalized intersections and the signal control system to maintain as well.

**Landscaping Program**  
Department crews also provide for the care and maintenance of the green spaces that protect and beautify our streets and traffic control features. Overall, we care for:

- 618 trees
- 350 irrigation zones (about 20 miles)
- 4800 plants
- 40 miles mowing maintenance
