

Billings City Administrator Weekly Report

December 15, 2023

- 1. Emergency Notification** - Code Red is being replaced with a different software system called EverBridge. KC will provide a presentation on the change early in 2024. The new system does not require an app just a phone number.
- 2. St Vincent/Intermountain Health** – Intermountain Health's development team is conducting a final review making sure the hospital replacement project is the right size. Their board will make a final decision no later than the second quarter 2024 (by June 30). While they are finalizing their decision work will continue on the prep work for the project.
- 3. CoC Annual Meeting** – the Continuum of Care held its annual meeting Tuesday. They elected a new board and voted to pursue splitting off from the State CoC. The board believes the State CoC is not working in the best interest of Billings and eastern Montana. Most of the money that comes from the federal government to the state continues to go to western MT even though we have most of the needs. This is not a final decision, but the vote was required to take the next step pursuing a split.
- 4. Yellowstone Conservation District** – Mike, Debi and I met with the YCD to continue pursuing state funding for the conservation and recreation investment at our west reservoir. Tuesday there will be a follow-up meeting that will include legislators, staff, and the mayor.
- 5. Budget and Finance Committee** - the committee reviewed the storm water fee proposal moving from annual to monthly. They reviewed the new city hall project voting to support upgrades to the elevators. They also reviewed upcoming budget amendments all of which are consistent with the adopted budget. This was the last meeting for the committee until the 2024 appointments are completed in January.
- 6. Legislative and Local Affairs Committee** – the committee discussed next steps to pursue legislative issues that came up during the fall MLCT conference and our public safety round table meetings. This was the last meeting for the committee until the 2024 appointments are completed in January.
- 7. CJCC Meeting** – The Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee shared progress across the justice system. Future meetings in 2024 will be back to the jail conference room. The county reported that their architect will be reporting back to them January 11th with base info on the jail site for both temporary and permanent expansion options.
- 8. Public Works News** - Public Works is moving away from uncontrolled intersections on local streets to improve safety. An uncontrolled intersection is one where no stop signs, traffic signals, road markings, or signs indicate driver right-of-way. Even though there is clear State law for motorist operation, many drivers are unclear of who yields to whom at uncontrolled intersections. Confusion over right-of-way contributes to uncontrolled intersection accidents. Furthermore, large, clear sight distances are required to stop for uncontrolled

intersections. These clear sight areas may be impeded by large trees, residential fences, park cars, and the like.

For new developments, controlled intersections (stop, signalized or roundabout) will be the norm in accordance with generally accepted engineering standards. Public Works will be reviewing certain areas of the city to add stop-controlled intersections, while maintaining neighborhood integrity and minimizing cut-through traffic with strategic placement of stop signs. Stay tuned for a roll-out of the plan.

9. **Park and Recreation News** - The Parks and Recreation Department would like to introduce our two new hires. John Gayvert and Brad Wright have been hired as Project Manager/Asset Coordinators. Both Brad and John are experienced and have already started moving projects through the system. We are excited to have both join our team.

Castle Rock Park Playground - The parts to repair the swings have arrived from the factory. The installer is onsite and repairing the swings is his top priority. Watch the PRPL website ([Update: Castle Rock Playground - Billings Parks and Recreation](#)) for updates.



North Park Restroom - The new restroom building for North Park was delivered on 12/11/2023. The restroom was paid for using CBDG grant funds. The new facility has 4 individual restrooms, so safety will improve. The restrooms will open next Spring when the Parks Division activates all the restrooms in the city.

Senior Recreation - Tis the season to celebrate. Over the last two weeks we have had several opportunities to celebrate the holiday season with our seniors. On December 4 the Breakfast Exchange and Zoo Montana hosted us for the tour of lights. Fifty seniors along with two staff toured the festive lights in Billings. This was the first time this event was hosted since 2019 and was well received by our seniors. We will be hosting the 2024 Christmas Celebration on December 15. Currently 106 seniors have signed up to join us for the celebration. Our partnership with the Adult Resource Alliance allows us to provide a meal at the Community Center.

For Senior Recreation and Wellness programming we continue to offer classes and activities. Typically, there is only a small dip in participation during the holidays. Many of the classes and activities have put on their own little holiday celebrations during or after the activity. One of the

biggest things we hear from participants continuing to come is they have built a community among their peers. This also helps those seniors who otherwise might face isolation have an opportunity to find joy and happiness. 11. Tester Secures \$3.5 Million for Billings Street Safety Improvements - (Big Sandy, Mont.) — U.S. Senator Jon Tester today secured \$3.56 million for street safety improvements in Billings, Montana. The funding comes from the Safe Streets for All (SS4A) grant program, which Tester established through his bipartisan *Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)*.

Tester worked with five Republicans and four Democrats to negotiate the IIJA and was the only member of Montana's Congressional delegation to vote for the bill.

"Montanans count on safe streets for everything from getting to and from their workplace to dropping their kids off safely at school," said Tester. **"These targeted dollars will help Billings plan for the future and make sure Montana students can get to and from Billings schools safely. I'm proud to have worked with both Republicans and Democrats to deliver this funding through my bipartisan infrastructure law, and I'm looking forward to seeing these critical upgrades being made across the Treasure State."**

This funding for the City of Billings through Tester's bipartisan infrastructure law will implement safety countermeasures at 11 intersections and 6 corridors in support of a Safe Routes to School initiative. The project will implement intersection safety improvements including high-visibility crosswalks, pedestrian-scale lighting, and enhanced signing; pedestrian, bicyclist, and ADA facilities, including sidewalks and shared-use paths, bicycle facilities, and ADA-compliant ramps; and traffic-calming treatments, including curb extensions and signal upgrades. The Safe Routes to Schools projects will make active transportation to and from Billings schools safer.

Tester secured significant wins for Montana in the legislation, including \$2.82 billion for Montana's roads, highways and bridges; \$2.5 billion to complete all authorized Indian water rights settlements; \$1 billion to complete all authorized rural water projects through the Bureau of Reclamation; \$65 billion to deploy broadband to areas across the country that lack internet access and additionally make online connectivity affordable; and \$3.37 billion to reduce wildfire risk nationwide, among others. Tester also worked to ensure that all iron, steel, and construction materials used for these projects must be made in America. 



Update on Grant Funding Received by the City of Billings December 2023

Safe Streets for All (SS4A)



Announced by Senator Tester on Dec. 11, 2023, the \$3.56 million Safe Streets for All (SS4A) grant funds 17 Safe Routes to Schools projects around Billings. The projects include six bicycle facilities, eight high-visibility crosswalks, two walkways (includes sidewalks and shared-use pathways), ADA-compliant ramps, lighting, signing, curb extensions, signal improvements and general traffic-calming elements. The projects have direct impacts on students traveling to Bench, Boulder, Burlington, Central Heights, Highland, McKinley, Miles Avenue, Orchard, Ponderosa, Sandstone, and Washington schools, as well as indirect impacts on routes to Lewis-Clark, Poly Drive, Meadowlark, Parkhill, and Big Sky schools.

About These Projects

The Safe Streets for All and Safe Routes to Schools projects move Billings forward in important ways:

- Students attending Highland, Washington, Lewis-Clark, Poly Drive, Miles Avenue, Meadowlark, Parkhill, Big Sky, Central Heights, and McKinley schools will access new bikeways and bike lanes in their neighborhoods.
- Students at Bench will gain important sidewalk connections at Rex Lane and Lola Lane.
- Students at Boulder and Burlington will utilize extended curbs that help reduce the amount of time needed to be in the crosswalk, and slowing traffic. Burlington students will also have access to a shared-use path connection from Arnold Drain to 24th Street W.
- Students at Burlington, Central Heights, Highland, McKinley, Miles Avenue, Orchard, Sandstone, and Washington will utilize high-visibility crosswalks.
- Ponderosa students who use the shared-use path from Ponderosa to Kings Green Drive will benefit from new pedestrian lighting.
- New signal timing and signage will also be made along pathways/intersections near Highland, Miles Avenue, Sandstone, and Washington schools.
