

Billings City Administrator Weekly Report

March 9, 2024

- 1. Tax Increment Financing Orientation** – CMs Aspenlieder and Kenedy met with staff from each of the three TIF districts, Andy Zoeller, and myself to cover upcoming policy issues and answer questions on our three districts.
- 2. Public Works Orientation** – Debi Meling and Jennifer Duray covered each of the PW divisions yesterday morning at Belknap.
- 3. Heights Water District** – A group made up of three HWD board members (Frank Ewalt, Jeff Essman and Laura Drager) met with Debi, Jennifer, and I to discuss a selection process to jointly hire a firm to provide a thorough analysis of the HWDs assets, liabilities, financial condition, and other critical information. It is essential that this work is done by a competent, independent group of experts to gather and assess information for the HWD Board, its customers, city administration, Council and the public to make a well-informed decision on the impacts of merging HWD into the City's water system. A thorough vetting process and decision is expected to take a few months. Once a decision is made and contracts are approved by both boards, we expect they will need 6-9 months to complete their analysis.
- 4. Teamster Contract Negotiations** – Over the past few weeks administration has held preparation meetings. The Teamsters contract is up for renewal July 1, 2024. The Teamsters represent all city's union members outside of sworn police officers and firefighters, therefore their members are in nearly every city department. The administration is committed to compensating our employees competitively and fairly while also providing excellent working conditions.

Update on Grant Funding Received by the City of Billings

March 2024

BPD Outfits Patrol Vehicles with Grant Funding



The Billings Police Department received funding through the 2023 Justice Assistance (JAG) Grant, which is administered by the US Department of Justice and the Montana Board of Crime Control.

The City of Billings Police Department (BPD) and Yellowstone County Sheriff's Office (YCSO) received a \$152,772 grant from the Montana Board of Crime Control (MBCC) and the US Department of Justice (DOJ) to purchase equipment and supplies. The YCSO share is \$20,611, while the BPD portion is \$132,161.

More About This Project

The BPD share of the grant will fund:

- Patrol SUV interior equipment
- Rechargeable flashlights
- Point Blank vests
- Simulation ammunition and TASER training cartridges
- Uniforms
- AED batteries and First Aid supplies

The grant maker:

- The MBCC receives funding from the DOJ to manage the Justice Assistance Grant program in Montana. The JAG grant assists local law enforcement in outfitting officers with the tools they need, whether they be for use in the office, training facility, vehicle, detention facility, or personal protective equipment.
- This is the largest JAG award given to BPD/YCSO in the last three years. Previous allocations were \$123,669 in FY22 and \$105,725 in FY21.


