

Billings City Administrator Weekly Report

October 11, 2024

- 1. SBURA Expansion Discussion** – Wyeth is making headway with consultants who can help us work through this process. The actual proposals from bidders will be coming in soon and we will bring forward a recommendation to the Council before Thanksgiving.
- 2. 2025 Legislative Session** – Jessica and I met with our Helena lobbying team (Aimee Grmoljez, Brad Longcake & Madison Tyson). We reviewed our priorities of safety, taxation and housing. Aimee joined our Legislative & Local Affairs Committee meeting. We will be hosting a legislative breakfast during the first week of December (the date will be confirmed Monday either December 2nd or 3rd). There were no surprises last week in West Yellowstone for the MLCT legislative agenda. Council will be asked to adopt a recommended resolution on October 28th.
- 3. CJCC Meeting** – The jails population is holding closer to 575 for the first time in a few years thanks to the good work of everyone across the system. The result is more beds available for offences including felony DUI's. We are working to make sure the short-term hold facility works as intended, including the opening of an arraignment court.
- 4. Northern Plaines Tree Board Discussion** - CM Shaw, director Pigg and I met with a group of citizens who continue to advocate for the benefits of a healthy urban forest and the creation of a forestry board. They are putting together an education effort for council and the public.
- 5. Property Development Requirements** - Administration, Public Works and Building discussed the impact of a permitting process (or no permitting process) for prebuilt storage units within a zoned area that allows storage units. We have more work to do before making a recommendation to Council.
- 6. SD2/City/County** – the Sheriff reported on the short-term hold facility. We provided our legislative priorities and SD2 covered Washington School/Public Charter School progress.
- 7. Parking Escalation Progress** – Please see the attached update of the parking escalation progress.



Billings airport breaks records as major upgrade and expansion nears completion

Recent investments in Billings Logan International Airport are paying off with record increases in passenger and aircraft activity this year. That helps with the push to **add flights and make Montana air travel more affordable**, Billings Director of Aviation and Transit Jeff Roach said.

For the first time in the airport's history, more than 50,000 passengers boarded flights each month in July and August. The previous record of 49,986 travelers was set in July 2019.

This year, 52,502 passengers boarded flights from Billings in July. Another record-breaking month followed with 50,179 travelers departing in August.

With 650,000 passengers traveling through Billings from January through August, the airport saw a 14.9% increase from last year. That puts it on track to serve a record 950,000 travelers by year's end, Roach said.

This year, Billings also exceeded 100,000 aircraft takeoffs and landings for the first time in nearly two decades, he said.

The boost in activity comes as work on the **\$60 million terminal upgrade and expansion** nears completion. Roach said the Billings airport is coming out of the 5-year project with almost no debt service and with airline operating costs still well below the national average. That helps keep ticket prices down and makes the airport more attractive to carriers that could add flights to new and existing destinations.

Landing new flights

Airport officials have been working with an airport consultant and community partners, such as the Billings Chamber of Commerce, the city's Tourism Business Improvement District and Big Sky Economic Development, to improve local air service.

They provide incentives to encourage airlines to start new routes or expand service.

The efforts have recently landed a number of new flights.

Year-round travel options improved with **United Airlines adding a fifth daily flight to Denver** and Alaska Airlines **expanding service to Portland**.





Seasonal flights have also increased with American Airlines **extending daily service to Chicago** and budget carriers adding new routes. Ahead of this summer's busy travel season, Allegiant Air and Sun Country Airlines launched twice-weekly services to **Los Angeles** and **Minneapolis**, respectively.

Roach said carriers often test a market by first offering seasonal flights. If the route turns a profit, the airline might decide to expand service.

American started a 70-day seasonal flight to Chicago and has already extended the service to 144 days. Roach said his team plans to keep encouraging the airline and other carriers to add flights to the city.

Developing new destinations

Specifically, they're pushing for year-round daily service to **Los Angeles or San Francisco**. Other high-priority markets they hope to connect with include Houston, Nashville and Atlanta.

Airlines decide where to fly, when to offer the service, and how much to charge for tickets, Roach said. But, in addition to keeping operating costs low, there are a number of things Billings is doing to sell itself to carriers and incentivize air service development.

Unlike other Montana airports that rely more heavily on leisure travel, Billings doesn't see as many peaks and troughs in seasonal demand throughout the year. That's because it serves about an even split of business and leisure travelers, Roach said.

In addition to steadier demand, he said, Billings has fewer flight diversions than other Montana airports. With 24-hour air traffic control and the longest runway in the state, Roach said, it's easier for aircraft to take off and land at Logan airport, even in severe weather.

Airport upgrades

The newly renovated terminal now has nine gates, plus space for Cape Air, which provides service to five smaller cities across Montana. For airlines, this means room for more passengers, as well as carrier-specific gates, Roach said.





The expansion also doubled the number of jet bridges to eight, allowing the airport to better serve larger, mainline aircraft. Roach said Billings is seeing fewer smaller, regional aircraft as the airline industry transitions to flying larger jets with more seats.

Passenger pleasers

Travelers have also been pleased with the upgraded amenities now available after passing through airport security. Roach said airport concessions are making record revenue.

The food court opened in early 2023 with Logan's Diner, Cinnabon and Stacked, A Montana Grill, providing a variety of offerings to hungry passengers. The modernized space features a robot that serves travelers craft beers, cocktails and espresso drinks from the new airport bar, Skyward Brews, and the Mountain Mudd coffee stand.

The autonomous server is affectionately called Rosey, a nostalgic nod to the charismatic robot maid who served the Jetsons in the classic 1970s cartoon.

"Rosey now has a boyfriend," Roach said, referring to the recent addition of a second robot server. "They've become very popular for people to see."

More modernization

Now that construction is nearing completion on the secure side of the terminal, airport officials are moving forward with plans to upgrade the ticket counters, baggage claim and car rental area, update the building's exterior and expand the parking lots. Roach said the work will be done in three phases and construction is expected to start next year.

“We’re really proud of all the expansion and additional development we’re doing,”

Roach said.

Package #2 plans and application were submitted via the City's web portal on Thursday, 10/3/24. The review timeframe for this package is 2 weeks or less.

All City reviews for Package #1 were completed on Monday, 9/23/24 and the permit was issued on Wednesday, 9/25/24 upon permit fee payment.

The City conducted a pre-construction meeting with the architect, contractor, and Yellowstone County on Wednesday, 9/25/24.

The General Contractor mobilized on site Monday, 10/7/24.

The project schedule put forth by the County is as follows:

Package #1: Demo, site work, and foundation - submit for permit on 9/4/24. Package #1 permit issued on 9/25/24.

Package #2: Structural, steel and CMU design – submitted for permit on 10/3/24.

Package #3: Interior fit out and full Construction Documents - submit for permit on 10/30/24.

Project completion in November 2025.
