

Billings City Administrator Weekly Report

May 30, 2025

- 1. Updated Utility Bill** - the enclosed bill DRAFT incorporates feedback we received from council members, the PW board and staff. The changes/additions are in blue on the latest draft. To implement the changes within the next few weeks we are asking that direction be given during the administration budget presentation Monday.

3. Should the total charge for each service be at the top or bottom of the service charge?
4. Should the West End line remain or be deleted?

7. Not specific to the bill template but when does the City Council want late fees to start and when should shut offs begin? The communication plan was sent in a previous email – are there other means by which the City Council wants us to communicate with our customers. (Plan as conveyed in email attached)

The back of the bill will be updated after Monday when we have all the comments. As of now, we are planning to add a comment about ERUs, WQAs and late fees/shut off information.

When the Council is satisfied with the bill template, we will forward it to the vendor, and it will be implemented within a couple of weeks.

- 2. Babcock Theater Temporary Closer** – thankfully no one was hurt. Part of the ceiling let loose earlier this week.



3. **Meeting with Corning's & Iron** – we discussed the temporary hold facility progress, safety downtown and throughout commercial areas throughout the city. We are looking into the merits of creating a BID pilot in one of their commercial areas to see if it is a good tool to lower crime and improve cleanliness.
4. **Parks & Recreation News** - The City of Billings Parks and Recreation Department is excited to announce the start of the aquatics season. Parks maintenance staff continued progress after opening all bathrooms for the season to open the spray ground locations at six parks for Memorial Day weekend. Certified recreation and maintenance staff are hard at work preparing pools for opening in June. (See attached press release.)
5. **Library News** - Student Writing Exhibit Showcases Young Authors at Billings Public Library.

This spring, K-3 students at Bitterroot Elementary and 5th-grade students at Alkali Creek Elementary have been sharpening their writing skills through focused genre-based instruction. As part of their opinion writing unit, students crafted thoughtful book reviews and local business recommendations, writing with real audiences in mind.

Their work has been published into individual books, which are now on display at the Billings Public Library. The exhibit, located on the Story Tower in the Children's Area, will be available for public viewing from May 27 to June 3. This project celebrates student voice, literacy growth, and the power of publishing opportunities for young writers. (Please see the June newsletter attached.)



- 1-2 months before the date – social media posts about the late fee date and how to set up payment plans
- Month before the date – issue press releases and communicate with media outlets.
- Two weeks to a month before the date – send letter to all past due accounts



The City of Billings Parks and Recreation Department is excited to announce the start of aquatics season. Parks maintenance staff continued progress after opening all bathrooms for the season to open the spray ground locations at six parks for Memorial Day weekend. Certified recreation and maintenance staff are hard at work preparing pools for opening in June.

Rose Pool and South Pool will open for the season on June 14th at noon. Wading pools at Pioneer Park and Hawthorne Park will open the following week on June 18th. To kick off the season at South Pool, free swimming lessons are available June 16th–19th; registration is required.

The aquatics staff will balance scheduling, training and certification over the coming weeks in preparation for the season. The department has over 60 lifeguard applicants for the season to staff swimming and wading pools across these four facilities. All lifeguards will complete the Red Cross Lifeguard and First Aid/CPR/AED Certification.

The operating schedule for each facility is as follows:

- Rose Pool is open daily 12–7pm.
- South Pool is open daily 12–6pm.
- Wading pools are open daily 12–6pm.
- All spray grounds operate on timers from 10am to 8pm.

Pools are slated to close for the season on August 30th, depending on availability and weather. The pool season will wrap up with the Annual Dog Days of Summer dogs-only swim on August 31st from 12-3pm. Adult companions are required to supervise their dogs. Dogs are \$4 each and humans are free.

At the time of writing the North Park spray grounds require some repairs before opening for the season. For more information about our pools and spray grounds, visit www.billingsparks.org/facilities/ and stay up to date on Billings Parks & Recreation social media platforms.



Project Updates

New Traffic Alerts:

- **Lane closures are expected next week on 6th Avenue North and Grand Avenue leading up to the intersection with North 32nd Street** for underground electrical work. Expect delays while these closures are in place.
- **Starting Wednesday, June 4, there will be a single-lane closure on North 32nd Street between 6th Avenue North and 4th Avenue North** to allow crews to begin storm drain improvements under the roadway.



Looking east from the corner of 4th Avenue North and North 32nd Street, crews complete underground electrical work.

Construction Update:

- Concrete work at the **2nd Avenue North/Division Street and 3rd Avenue North/Division Street intersections** will continue into next week. Expect short-term lane closures and intermittent delays as this work is completed.
- Underground electrical work has been completed at the **North 32nd Street/4th Avenue North intersection, near the YMCA**. Work on the ADA ramps will continue into the coming weeks. Pedestrian access will be impacted--please

follow all traffic control. **Expect short-term lane closures and intermittent delays as work is completed.**

- Concrete work is expected to begin at the **North 34th Street and 3rd Avenue North intersection** next week.
- **ADA upgrades will be completed early next week** at these intersections:
 - North 29th Street/2nd Avenue North
 - North 30th Street/2nd Avenue North



As part of a separate project, the City of Billings is **replacing water main under the roadway on 2nd Avenue North between North 31st and North 29th Streets**. Please follow traffic control and expect minor delays when traveling through this area.
