Hello All,

I have been asked by the board of Big Sky Apartments to provide the council with an update regarding the leak recently discovered at our property.

Here is some information regarding the leak and repair going on in unit Stillwater 306 and 206 at Big Sky.

1. The resident in Stillwater 206 reported water dripping from her ceiling on Monday, February 9, around noon. Maintenance immediately went to her unit and traced the leak back through her ceiling to the wall of the unit above, unit Stillwater 306. Jeremy immediately began pulling out her drywall to determine where the water was coming from.
2. The leak originated on the roof of the Stillwater building, where faulty silicon around the roof drain was allowing water into the wall. Kevin Wise Construction came Monday afternoon and stopped the leak. The roof drain and drainage issue was fully repaired by Kevin Tuesday morning.
3. Staff immediately contacted Billings Disaster Restoration, who informed us that we needed to dry the wall so that they could come assess the damage. Their team was on site yesterday to inspect the units and prepare a bid (we have not received it yet, they said they should have it to us by Friday.)
4. Christie from Northern Industrial Hygiene was on site at Big Sky yesterday and tested the wall interior for mold and asbestos, as well as tested the air quality in both units for mold spores. The results of the mold tests should be back this afternoon, asbestos testing will be back Friday. We ordered expedited results for both tests.
5. Tenants from BOTH units S206 and S306 were booked hotels yesterday, Tuesday, February 10, at the expense of the property, and relocated Tuesday, February 10 through Friday, February 20, pending the results of the testing for their safety. Their stays will be extended if necessary.

Bid for repair and remediation will be forwarded to the board upon receipt for approval. Andy, from Billings Disaster Restoration, advised that the leak had been ongoing for a while, but because it was absorbing into the wall, there was no way to be aware of the problem. It most likely only started to actively drip because of the rain on Monday.

I will keep the board apprised of all remediation steps.

Please let me know if anyone would like any more information at this time.

Please do check into our court system to make sure that our constitution can be upheld... my beliefs have been harmed here, and are starting to get corrupted by the system not allowing me the right. Thank you for your time. I cannot study and practice my own religion as a peaceful dynamic, if it is constantly in danger of being treated like it is not a relationship. I am being outsourced, and reinvented under a program that does not exist in my field, because it medicates away the skill and intellectual property designed there. Thank you. I am not sure of who all I should contact to review my case.

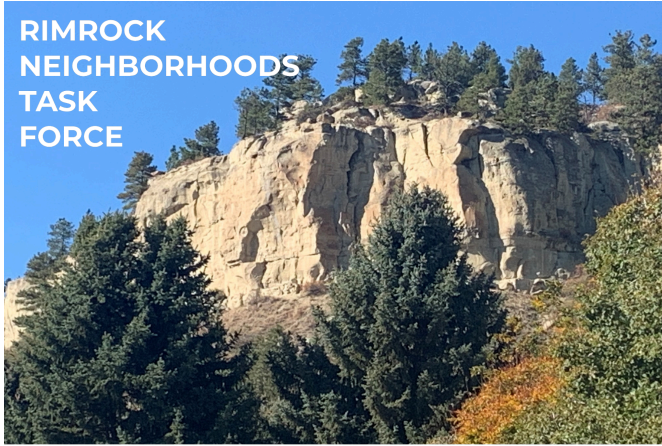

There is hereby created an Aviation and Transit Board. The Aviation and Transit Board shall be composed of seven members, each of who will possess the qualifications for office required for the office of Mayor and shall be appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the Council.

The Board shall be a citizen's advisory board to the City Council to aid the City Council in formulating City policy in matters pertaining to the MET Transit System, Airport and the concomitant properties. The primary responsibility of the Board is to review existing and proposed City policies and to review City department activities to ensure that City policies are being implemented and carried out and further, to report any shortcomings and make recommendations to the City Council.
