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### ***From the Desk of Howard Evans, RNTF Chair***

***Hello neighbors,***

***Rimrock Neighborhoods Task Force Board*** is still short a board member and we are asking for a volunteer to fill the position of secretary. Filling this position has become more important with my decision to not seek another term as your Chair.

*This board has adopted three main areas of concern which we feel are important to our membership:*

- 1. Rimrock Road Safety - efforts led by Tom & Leslie***
- 2. North of the Rims development and Highway 3 Corridor - efforts led by Howard***
- 3. City Parks and Trails - efforts led by Kevin***

*Of course, there are other city wide items which become important to our membership and we try to address them as they arise. We need help to do this.*

***By-Laws.*** The Board is recommending a change to the RNTF by-laws to allow more flexibility in scheduling meetings should the need arise. It is not our intention to randomly change meetings believing that a predictable meeting time and place is the best course of action.

*The proposed change is included at the end of this newsletter and a vote will be taken at our next membership meeting in March.*

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**Rehberg Ranch HOA** invited Leslie and I to make a short presentation to their membership. We were received warmly and felt that a seed of awareness was planted in their membership. We were able to add several new contacts to our email list.

**Rimrock Corridor**. Leslie and Tom continue to work diligently to provide meaningful input to the Transportation Master Plan.

**Rim Top**. Work continues on the BLAASF installation. Anderson Construction supplies me with a weekly construction update which I forward to Rim Top neighbors. To the best of my knowledge, public input has not been sought in the Highway 3 Corridor Study nor in land planning along Highway 3 and Skyway Drive.

**Fire Dangers**. The fires in Los Angeles and Alkali Creek last summer have brought to light the need to be proactive in securing fire safety. While we don't have the same climatic conditions as California, we need to be aware of ways to protect our property interests. I am currently working with the City Fire Marshall and Code Enforcement to provide information and, possibly, evaluating fire dangers in our neighborhoods. The State does not have policy cancellation data available, so the extent of cancellations cannot be evaluated.

**Meeting attendance**. We are always looking for increased participation in our meetings and urge you to join us. We are exploring ways to communicate with neighbors who are not receiving meeting information.

# Bird Flu



### What you need to know about bird flu and your risk

Avian influenza (bird flu) Type A viruses are widespread in wild birds worldwide and are causing outbreaks in poultry and dairy cows in the U.S. Bird flu does not normally infect people, but rare cases of human infection have occurred, mainly in dairy and poultry workers.

Bird flu illnesses in humans have ranged in severity from no symptoms or mild illness to severe disease, and there has been one death reported in the U.S.

Montana has not detected any cases of bird flu in humans, but it has been found in domestic poultry flocks, wild birds and other mammals like bears, raccoons, mountain lions, skunks and domestic cats in the state.

The best way to prevent bird flu is to avoid sources of exposure whenever possible. Infections in people happen most often after close, prolonged and unprotected contact with infected birds or other animals.

### What to do to protect yourself

- People should avoid direct contact with sick or dead wild birds, poultry, and other animals and observe them only from a distance.
- If you must have direct/close contact with sick or dead wild birds, poultry, or other animals, wear recommended personal protective equipment (PPE). Wild birds can be infected with avian influenza even if they don't look sick.
- Do not touch surfaces or materials like bedding material contaminated with saliva, mucus or animal feces from wild or domestic birds or other animals with confirmed or suspected avian influenza infection.
- Do not touch or consume raw milk or raw milk products, especially from animals with confirmed or suspected avian influenza infection.
- Protect your pets – avoid feeding them raw food or milk.

If a person is hospitalized with the flu, the healthcare facility will do a test to determine the subtype of influenza causing the infection. It is important to let your doctor know if you have contact with domestic or wild birds or dairy cows that may put you at higher risk for a bird flu infection.

## CYBER-SAFETY TIP

Disasters bring more than physical damage — they leave us vulnerable to cyber threats. Criminals can take advantage during a crisis to trick us into giving away personal info.

After the California fires, many received fake fundraising requests or fraudulent government emails. Scams can be hard to spot, especially when emotions are high.

### Use these 4 simple steps to protect yourself:

1. Be cautious with unsolicited requests. If you receive a donation request or help offer via text, email or social media - verify the source before responding.
2. Look for red flags. Scammers often create a sense of urgency like “ACT NOW” or “RESPOND IMMEDIATELY”. Don’t rush - take your time to double check details.

3. **Verify official communications.** Check directly with official agencies such as FEMA via their official websites or by phone. Don't click on links in unsolicited messages.
4. **Support with trusted resources.** If you want to help disaster victims - use well known organizations, and make sure donations go through their official websites.

In times of disaster, it's crucial to not only take care of ourselves and others physically, but also to stay sharp and protect our digital lives.



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## Proposed by-law changes to be discussed and voted on during the March 19, 2025 RNTF meeting:

### Article VIII: Meetings - Current

Section 1: Regular meetings shall be held on the third Wednesday of the following months: January, March, May, July, September and November. Meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. and end by 9:00 p.m., or as indicated in the agenda. Special meetings may be called and held as necessary.

Section 2: Agenda items should be submitted to the Chair at least 15 days in advance of the meeting. This agenda will be submitted to the City of Billings for publication on their website at: [www.billingsmt.gov/1730/Rimrock-Neighborhoods-Task-Force](http://www.billingsmt.gov/1730/Rimrock-Neighborhoods-Task-Force)

Section 3: Meetings will be held at Mayflower Church on the corner of Poly Drive and Rehberg Lane..

Section 4: The minutes of the last general meeting should be submitted to the City of Billings for publication on their web site within 30 days after the meeting.

### PROPOSED CHANGE

Section 1: Regular general meetings shall be held on the third Wednesday of the following months: January, March, May, July, September, and November. General meetings begin at 7:00 p.m. and end by 9:00 p.m., or as indicated in the agenda. Special meetings may be called and held as necessary.

Section 2: General meetings will be held at Mayflower Church on the corner of Poly Drive and Rehberg Lane.

Section 3: By majority vote the Board may change the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 in a manner which provides our membership 30 days' notice, unless the change was made for emergency reasons. Should the Board change these provisions, notice will be posted on the City of Billings website at [www.billingsmt.gov/1730/Rimrock-Neighborhoods-Task-Force](http://www.billingsmt.gov/1730/Rimrock-Neighborhoods-Task-Force), and will be emailed to members who have provided their email contact info to the task force board. In the event of a tie vote by members of the Board, the Chair will break the tie, making the final decision.

Section 4: Agenda items for regular general meetings should be submitted to the Chair at least 15 days in advance of the scheduled meeting date, and should be sent by email to

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rimrocktaskforce@gmail.com. Each regular general meeting's agenda will be submitted to the City of Billings for publication on their website at:

Section 5: The minutes of each general meeting will be submitted to the City of Billings for publication on their web site, which is noted in Sections 3 and 4, within 30 days after the meeting, and will be emailed to our membership email list.

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
