

By-Law Changes. There are 2 changes to the RNTF by-laws which will be voted on at the May meeting. Reference to existing by-laws can be found by going to the RNTF page on the

City's website <https://www.billingsmt.gov/1730/Rimrock-Neighborhoods-Task-Force> and selecting by-laws.

Change to Article VIII, will allow the board to be more flexible in scheduling meeting time, place, and date should the need arise.

Change to Article V Section 3 will change Board terms for the July 2025 election, allowing a continuity of Board knowledge.

Call for Nominations. Nominations will be sought for all Board positions at our May meeting. Duties of Board Members can be found in the by-laws cited above. Board members can be contacted for further insights. An active RNTF provides residents the ability to be heard and informed on matters affecting their neighborhood. Please consider being part of the team. The board elections will be conducted at the July meeting.

Airport Construction. Construction on the expansion and repair of runway 7/25 at the Billings Airport will begin when weather permits. Be aware of additional construction equipment on Hwy 3 and the roads leading to it. Future air traffic impact is unknown at this time, but part of the purpose in improving runways is to accommodate larger aircraft.


Parks. At our last meeting Council members Boyett and Rogers briefly discussed an initiative adopted by City Council to eliminate small parcels of parkland from the parks inventory through return to private ownership. We have identified two parcels in our task force area:

1. Parcel A06409A which is located north of Edmond Street.
2. Parcel A20235A located between Morledge St. and Ramada Drive

We are working with Council member Rogers who is heading this effort and will keep our membership updated.

Microsoft 365 Users Take Note: New AI Feature May Be Monitoring Your Work

If you've recently updated your Microsoft 365 apps like Word, Excel, or PowerPoint, you may have noticed a new feature quietly appearing...**Copilot**, Microsoft's AI-powered assistant.

This tool is designed to offer real-time suggestions and support, but what many users don't realize is that **Copilot actively analyzes everything you write** in order to provide those suggestions. That includes drafts, notes, and personal content. In fact, the system learns from your keystrokes and feeds your data into Microsoft's AI training systems.

The surprising part? This "feature" comes with a **43% price hike** for Microsoft 365 subscribers, and it's automatically turned on.

For those who prefer privacy and more control over their workflow, Copilot *can* be turned off.

Did you know that the areas served by the Billings & Butte Vitalant centers need to collect 2,000 units of blood each month to meet the needs of area patients?

Only about 3% of the US population donates blood. Hospitals always need more people to join in this life saving mission.

Blood donations are used to treat traumatic injuries, however most donations go toward patients with serious medical conditions, this includes cancers.


During the COVID pandemic, blood donation guidelines changed. If you've been told in the past you couldn't donate, please check again with Vitalant.

How you can protect yourself and your family from measles

Measles is a highly contagious and serious viral illness. This year, there have been nearly 500 cases in 20 states, and 2 deaths, according to data from the CDC.

Measles is especially dangerous for babies and young children. 75% of cases and most of the hospitalizations nationwide in 2025 are children under 19 years old. 97% of the cases this year are in people who are unvaccinated or have an unknown vaccination status.

Montana has not had a case of measles since 1990, and as of March 31, there are no cases reported in the state. Because of the success of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine, many people have never witnessed or experienced how serious the measles can be.

Measles can result in severe health complications, including pneumonia, encephalitis (inflammation of the brain), and death, particularly in unvaccinated people.

The virus is spread through direct contact with infectious droplets or by airborne spread when an infected person breathes, coughs, or sneezes. Measles is so contagious that up to 90% of non-immunized people exposed to an infected person will become sick. The virus can remain infectious in the air and on surfaces for up to two hours after an infected person leaves an area.

Immunization: The best line of defense

Measles is almost entirely preventable through the safe and highly effective MMR vaccines. Two doses are 97% effective against measles, and one dose is 93% effective.

Children should receive their first dose of MMR at age 12 to 15 months and their second dose at four to six years. Unvaccinated adults may need one or two doses of MMR vaccine if they do not have evidence of immunity. People born before 1957 are considered to have presumed immunity.

If you're experiencing fever and rash and are concerned that you may have been exposed to measles, call your healthcare provider or emergency department first to tell them you are worried about measles so they can plan for your visit.

People planning to travel internationally or to an area of the U.S. experiencing an outbreak should check with their health care provider about immunizations.

To schedule an immunization at RiverStone Health, go to RiverStoneHealth.org/Immunizations to schedule online or call 406-247-3382. If you are uninsured, the vaccines may be available at no cost.


